ACA Mentee Orientation Information

Welcome to the ACA Mentorship Program, we are thrilled you are participating! The goal of the ACA mentoring program is to facilitate the integration of new archivists into the Canadian archival community by matching them with mentors who may advise and guide them on work and career management issues.

You will be matched with your mentor by mid-January and the ACA Mentorship Coordinator will introduce you to your mentor by the end of January.

Your Role

Your main role is to have fun! Your ACA Mentor is here to provide you with a friendly point of contact with the Canadian archival community and a safe place to ask some of your unanswered questions about archival concepts and practice and the archival profession as a whole. The types of topics you might ask your ACA Mentor about include:

- How they came to decide on becoming an archivist
- What they like/dislike about being an archivist
- Special interest areas of archives that your Mentor is interested in and why
- Approaches to academic research, essay writing, and archival studies in general
- Balancing life and school
- Pros and Cons of working in different archival settings (academic, business, religious, etc.)
- Practicalities of working in the archival profession (conferences, continuing professional development, grant writing, etc.)
- Advice on job searching and CV building

The recommended mentorship period is one year, however, the mentoring relationship may continue if both parties agree. The suggested role for the mentor is to: give information relating to career and skill development; listen and provide feedback; give advice and concrete suggestions on professional development; and reflect what is expected and valued in the archival profession. It is the responsibility of the new archivist/student (mentee) to respect the other commitments of the mentor (i.e., working around the mentor's schedule).
